New Strict Statewide Storm Water NPDES Permit You Ask – Who Can Help Me?

As you may be aware, the New Statewide Storm Water Permit has been adopted and becomes fully effective July 1, 2010. In addition to affecting projects that begin after that date, we want to make sure you know it will affect current projects. If you have current projects that will remain active after July 1, 2010, you will be impacted.

The new general permit requires you to work with a team of professionals that can guide you to successful, compliant, and profitable projects based on these new and more stringent regulations. The current NPDES Permit, which is less stringent and more general than the newly adopted one, does not require the higher professional standards and expertise to assure compliance. Here are some of the Important Elements required under the New Permit;

1. Using new electronic reporting (SMARTs Program) for data and report information transmittal
2. Filing of all Project Related Documents (PRDs) prior to project commencement and during life of project
3. Preparing SWPPPs, Annual Reports, Sampling Reports required under Permit
4. Numeric Effluent Limits (NELs) for turbidity and pH at Risk 2 & 3 /medium and high risk construction sites
5. Sampling Procedures during Rain Events
6. Setting Numeric Action Levels (NALs) to evaluate BMP self performance for sites
7. Preparing Rain Event Action Plans (REAP)
8. Understanding Active Treatment Systems (ATS) requirements
9. Receiving water sampling/monitoring for turbidity and pH
